# MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE PARISH COUNCIL HELD ON 22<sup>nd</sup> September 2021

**PRESENT:** Cllr W Clouston, Chair of the Council together with Cllrs Mrs E S Buckley, N M Oliver, C G Curry, M J Stone, L Rogers.

- 0921.01 **TO ACCEPT AND APPROVE APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE.** Apologies received from Cllr L Stenhouse, S Ahmed and Mrs M V Kemp.
- 0921.02 **TO RECEIVE DECLARATIONS OF COUNCILLORS' INTEREST.** Cllr N M Oliver declared a personal and prejudicial interest in item 0921.07 as a member of Northumberland County Council's Planning Committees.
- 0921.03 **TO APPROVE AND SIGN THE MINUTES OF THE COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON 28 JULY 2021.** It was proposed by Clir N M Oliver, seconded by Clir Mrs E S Buckley and AGREED to approve and sign the minutes of the Council Meeting held on 28 July 2021 as an accurate record.
- 0921.04 ACTIONS TAKEN FOLLOWING THE MEETING HELD ON 28 JULY 2021.
  - a) **CO-OPTION TO FILL ONE VACANCY.** Minute 0721.11 refers. There is still one vacancy to be filled on the Parish Council.
  - b) **ROMAN SIGN.** Minute 0721.09b refers. Collection of the sign is still to be arranged.
- 0921.05 FINANCE/ADMINISTRATION
  - a) **ACCOUNTS FOR PAYMENT.** It was AGREED to approve the items of expenditure on the lists, previously circulated. (Appendix A).
  - b) TO ACCEPT AND APPROVE THE NOTICE OF CONCLUSION OF AUDIT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2021. It was AGREED to accept and approve the Notice of Conclusion of Audit for the year ended 2021 there being no matters arising from the review undertaken by PKF Littlejohn LLP.
- 0921.06 **PLANNING DECISIONS.** It was AGREED that the Council receive the details of the Planning Decisions made by Northumberland County Council, in accordance with the list circulated. (Appendix C).
- 0921.07 **PLANNING APPLICATIONS.** It was AGREED to accept the decisions of the Planning Advisory Group in accordance with the list circulated. (Appendix B).
- 0921.08 **CORRESPONDENCE**. Correspondence and information items received since the July meeting had been listed on the agenda and were noted. (Appendix D). (*Note: wherever possible, all communications addressed to the Council are circulated to Councillors by email for information as and when received).* 
  - a) **Climate Emergency Declaration.** Northumberland County Council's Climate Change Team are consulting with Parish/Town Councils to request the following information:
    - Has your Parish Council declared a climate emergency? No. Corbridge Parish Council felt that declaring a climate emergency should be backed up with action on initiatives.
    - Does your Parish Council have any plans to address climate change and reduce emissions?
      The Parish Council is looking into installing ground source heat pumps in the Community
      Housing on the Miller Homes site and is currently looking for land for a large tree planting
      scheme.
    - Would you like the support of the County Council to help develop your climate change plans? Help with funding to install a ground source heating scheme in the Parish Hall and help with tree planting would be welcomed.
  - b) Speeding. Further complaints from residents regarding the speed of traffic on Aydon Road had been received. It is planned to have the Vehicle Activated Sign rotated to catch speeding traffic heading up Aydon Road. The Parish Council will investigate installing an additional Vehicle Activated Sign at the top of Aydon Road. The most recent speed data from the 3 vehicle activated signs had been downloaded and sent to Northumbria Police. Cllr N M Oliver had met with Inspector Gary Neill, Northumbria Police who will carry out more enforcement in Corbridge.
- 0921.09 TO RECEIVE REPORTS, IF APPROPRIATE FROM WORKING/LIAISON GROUPS WITH ENCLOSED MINUTES, IF APPLICABLE INCLUDING REPORTS FROM THE CHAIRMAN AND COUNTY COUNCILLOR.
  - a) Chairman's Report. Cllr Clouston gave his verbal report on outstanding issues.
    - Corchester Field. The structural survey of the pavilion had been completed and the
      report will be circulated to all councillors for comment. An application will be submitted to
      the S106 Housing Developers Fund to replace the fencing, provide cycle racks and
      provide portable goal posts. Cllr N M Oliver had spoken to the funding officers who
      confirmed that the improvements would qualify for the S106 fund. The Archaeological dig
      had been successful however the area needs some attention. English Heritage will pay
      for the area to be cleared and levelled.

- Cemetery. The cemetery gates had been refurbished and Cllr W Clouston is to ask Steena Steward to provide a design for the maintenance gate to match the main gates. A question was asked regarding digital mapping of the cemetery. Cllr N M Oliver is to enquire at Woodhorn Archives to see if they can provide this kind of service. A discussion took place over bringing the chapels back into use. This is to be discussed in further detail.
- Market Place. Information is still awaited.
- **Highways and Neighbourhood Services Liaison Meetings.** The Parish Council is keen to restart these meetings. The clerk will contact the various NCC departments to arrange.
- **b)** County Councillor's Report. Cllr N M Oliver gave his verbal report on matters related to Corbridge Parish and the wider County area.
  - **Devils Water Bridge Launch Event** is to take place 3<sup>rd</sup> week in October. The signs have still not been erected however these should be in place 1<sup>st</sup> week in October.
  - **Skate Park.** A meeting to discuss the replacement of the skatepark will take place on Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup> October at 6pm.
  - Highway Issues Update. The resurfacing of the driveways on The Crofts Estate had been
    completed and the improvements to the footpaths on Main Street are currently being carried
    out. The following improvements had been requested: dropped kerb at The Crofts on
    Newcastle Road to allow access to the bus stop and a handrail by the steps which lead to
    The Crofts Estate from Newcastle Road.
  - Tree Works. Cllr Oliver had met with the NCC Tree Officer and Karbon Homes to discuss the work needed to the trees at Manor Cottages. Work will be carried out by Karbon Homes in due course.
  - Events. The Village Show had been restarted this year and was a successful event with a steady stream of visitors. Tynedale Beer and Cider Festival had also taken place and was very well attended.
- c) To receive Councillors reports on any village/highway issues. The grit bin on Aydon Estate has still not been moved and the dog bin on Appletree Lane is still to be installed. The clerk will chase up these issues.

# 0921.10 **TO CONSIDER PRIOR TIES FOR SUBMISSION TO THE LOCAL TRANSPORT PLAN PROGRAMME 2022-2023.** Parish Councils are asked to submit their top three highways and transport priority issues to NCC to be considered for inclusion in the LTP Programme 2022-2023. After discussion, the following priorities were AGREED: 1) 20mph in the centre of the village; 2) Footpath from Farnley to Corbridge. The footpath comes to a sudden end on the A695 and the houses in Farnley do not have any pedestrian access to the village. 3) Measures to restrict fly parking outside the Co-op on Hill Street. A small build out with bollards would act as a deterrent and increase safety.

The following feedback had been received on the submitted priorities from 2021-2022.

Traffic calming measures on Stagshaw Road.	Phase 1 (design and estimating) included in the programme. Construction during 2022-23 subject to cost and feasibility. This also includes Newcastle Road and Aydon Road and is in the final stage of design. The Parish Council is awaiting the reports.
Review of 20mph in the centre of the village	Not included. Current priority is being given to 20mph speed limits at schools. This is to be resubmitted for inclusion in 2022-23. NCC will try and roll the whole scheme together.

# 0921.11 **TO RECEIVE UPDATE ON THE COMMUNITY LED HOUSING SCHEME AND SIGN TRANSFER FOR PLOT 66.** The golden brick payment of £14,450 is now due on Plot 66 which is the two-bed bungalow. This property is due for completion in March 2022. It was AGREED to sign the transfer and pay the golden brick payment. A subcommittee is to be formed and members of the community, with the appropriate experience, will be invited to join.

0921.12 **TO DISCUSS ARRANGEMENTS FOR RBL REMEMBRANCE PARADE.** A request had been received from RBL Corbridge Branch asking the Parish Council to take over the arrangements for the Remembrance Day Parade and for the event to be covered under the Council's insurance. RBL local branches are no longer allowed to be the event organiser of street Parades. It was AGREED the Parish Council would take over this responsibility and the clerk will make the necessary arrangements for the road closures.

#### 0921.13 ANY URGENT BUSINESS ALLOWED BY THE CHAIRMAN [FOR INFORMATION ONLY] .

- a) **Parish Hall wall.** Concerns had been expressed regarding the effects of the cherry tree on the Parish Hall wall. This had been looked at by a tree surgeon and a builder who both advised that there was no issue.
- b) **Electric Vehicle Charging Points.** Cllr N M Oliver advised that 6 EV charging points would be installed in Corbridge in the bays opposite Bishops Garage. Objections had been received by residents on Main Street. These bays will not be for sole use of electric vehicles and may be used by all. The charging points are aimed at residents with no off-street parking. This is a pilot programme funded by Central Government. Other areas in Corbridge are being investigated.
- c) Railway bridge railings. The railings need painting. Cllr Oliver to enquire as to who is responsible.
- d) Car Boot Fair Traffic. It was noted that the traffic on Wednesdays travelling to the car boot sale is backed up into the village and along Main Street. This is potentially a traffic light sequencing issue. Cllr Oliver to investigate.
- e) **Main Street bollard.** One of the bollards at the pinch point on Main Street has been hit by a vehicle. 0921.14 **DATE OF NEXT MEETING.** The next meeting will be of the Parish Council will take place on Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> October 2021 at 19:00 in Room One of Corbridge Parish Hall.
